Mark 4:35-41

Today's reading is from the Gospel of Mark and in it we hear how one evening, while Jesus and his disciples were near the lake, he said to them, "Let's go now to the other side." When they were crossing the lake, a bad storm came up, and a strong wind washed the waves over the side of the boat. Soon the boat was nearly filled with water. But Jesus was asleep on a pillow in the back of the boat. The disciples woke him and said, "Don't you care that we're going to drown?" So Jesus got up and commanded the wind and waves to stop, saying, "Be still! Be quiet!" Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Why are you afraid? Don't you believe in me?" The disciples were shocked and amazed at what they had just seen Jesus do. They kept asking each other, "Who is this man? Even the wind and the water obey him!"

Have you ever experienced a bad storm? Were you afraid? Can you imagine how the disciples felt? Can you understand their fear? Share with others your experiences with fear. Was Jesus there for you? How? Can you think of a time when you had a storm inside yourself (problems or things that worried you)? How do you think Jesus would calm that kind of a storm? Why were the disciples amazed at what Jesus did to the storm? Would you have been amazed? Why or why not?
