Mark 9:30-37

In the Gospel today we see Jesus and his disciples journeying through Galilee. Jesus is again telling of his coming passion and resurrection but the disciples do not understand. The disciples begin arguing about who is greatest among them. Jesus tells them, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all." This teaching tells us about behavior and attitude. We offer our efforts in the service of others to make life better for them in some way.
