



Confirmation Preparation schedule

Requirements

Details will be discussed during the preparation course. Students enrolling in the program must be prepared to adhere to the following requirements:

Attendance at preparation meetings

The meetings listed above are critical touchstones in the confirmation preparation process. They offer catechesis, personal and group reflection, and a scaffold for your walks toward the sacrament of confirmation. Attendance is mandatory for the program. Successful completion of the course includes no more than one class absence.

Completion of Home-Work activities/assignments

In addition to live classes and prayer, students will complete important assignments throughout their preparation to help better ready themselves for the gift of Confirmation.

Participation in service & Regular mass attendance

As a vital part of faith-development, mass attendance and service with friends and family serves as a cornerstone of the confirmation preparation process. Details on how to do this safely during the pandemic will be discussed during the course.

Open heart and a willing spirit

The gifts of the spirit, the personal transformation and understanding that comes through the process of confirmation preparation are only received to open hearts. This work is something that requires a willingness to be vulnerable, honest, and accepting of God's love and grace.
